USER MANUAL

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1.0 INTRODUCTION

Thank you for purchasing the ZX-DC200 / ZX-DC200SL dual lens compact digital camera. Please read through this user manual before using the camera and retain this user manual for future reference.

2.0 FEATURES

- 1080p Full HD Recording
- 8MP + 2MP Camera Sensor
- 2.4" Screen

3.0 IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

1. Press the buttons gently. Pressing the buttons too hard may damage the device.
2. Disconnect the USB charging cable from the camera, power source and computer when the device is left unused for a long period of time.
3. Do not disconnect the device from a computer while file transfer is still in progress.
4. Only use this device in a dry location.
5. Do not store the device near a heat source or in dirty, humid or wet places.
6. Do not place the device in places with high temperatures (over 40°C), especially not in a car with the windows closed during summer. Keep the device out of direct sunlight.
7. Do not attempt to disassemble this device. There are no user serviceable parts inside this device.

3.1 BATTERY SAFETY

This device uses a lithium-ion battery. When handled incorrectly, a Li-ion battery can be dangerous and potentially harm people or damage property.

1. Keep the battery pack away from young children.
2. Do not disassemble, drop, damage, crush, puncture and incinerate the battery pack.
3. Do not short circuit and do not allow metal objects to come into contact with the battery terminal.
4. Always unwind the USB cable before charging.
5. Do not charge the battery in temperatures higher than 40°C or lower than 0°C.
6. Do not overcharge the camera battery. Once the battery is fully charged, remove the charging cable from the camera as soon as possible. Do not leave the battery charging unattended.
7. Always charge the camera battery in a safe environment away from flammable materials.
8. Battery charging is to be conducted under adult supervision.
9. Do not use the camera if the device or battery is damaged, leaking, making abnormal sounds and/or punctured.

3.2 CARE AND MAINTENANCE

1. Do not drop the device on a hard surface to avoid damage.
2. Do not expose the device to moisture and liquids.
3. Keep the device clean by wiping it with a dry soft cloth. Disconnect the device from the power source before cleaning.
4. Keep the camera lens and display surface clean for clear image by using a clean, dry, non-alcohol cotton swab.
5. Do not use alcohol, thinners, or benzene to clean the device surface.

3.3 PRODUCT DISPOSAL

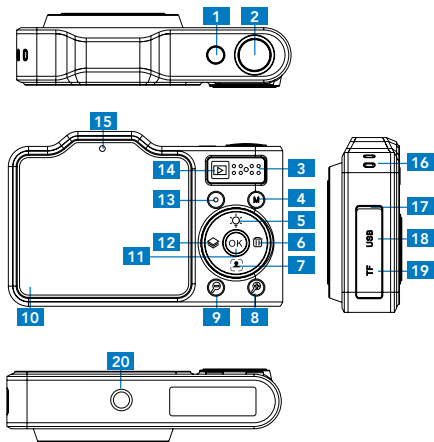
1. This device comes with a lithium battery. Please observe local regulations regarding the disposal of old devices with batteries.

BUTTON	FUNCTIONS
Power Button	Long press to turn the camera on/off .
Shutter Button	Ensure that a memory card is installed.
	In image mode: takes photos.
	In video mode: starts/ends recording.
	In playback mode: plays/pauses video files.
Playback Button	Press to enter/exit playback mode.
Strap Lug	For attaching a camera strap.
Tripod Mount	Standard screw port for tripod mount (not included).
Charging Port Cover	Open to access Micro SD card slot and USB Type-C interface.
Speaker Outlet	Sound outlet.
USB Port	USB charging port and data cable connection.
Indicator Light	Blue light: camera is in operation mode.
	Red light: camera is charging.
	Red light goes out: battery is fully charged.
Macro Button	Turns on/off macro function in image and video modes for capturing a sharper image of an object at 10cm away from the front lens.
Mode Button	Switches between image mode , video mode or settings mode .

	In video playback mode: press to stop playback.

Zoom Out (-) Button	In image/video mode: zooms out.

Up Key (Flash)	In image mode: switches between flash ON , flash OFF and flash AUTO modes.
	In settings mode: navigates settings menus.
OK Button	Confirms selection.
	In playback mode: stops/resumes playing video file.
Right Key (Delete)	Calls up delete menu in image/video/playback mode.
Down Key (Selfie and Timer)	In image mode: long press the button for 3 seconds to switch between front and rear lens. Short press the button to switch between 2 seconds , 5 seconds and 10 seconds timer mode control.
	In settings mode: navigates settings menus.
Left Key (Filter)	In image mode: switches between filter options.
Microphone	Microphone port for voice recording.

4.3 CHARGING THE BATTERY

Fully charge the battery before first use. It takes approximately 1.5 hours to fully charge the camera's Li-ion battery pack.

- Peel open the **Charging Port Cover**.
- Connect one end of the supplied USB cable to the camera USB port and the other end to a 5V  1A max DC source like the USB port on a computer.
- The indicator light turns solid red when charging is in progress.
- The indicator light turns off when the battery is fully charged.
- Do not leave the battery on charge overnight.

When the screen shows a low battery icon, recharge the battery as soon as possible.

5.0 OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

5.1 POWERING ON/OFF

- To turn **ON/OFF** the camera, press and hold the **Power Button**.

The camera will automatically turn off after the preset Auto Power Off time to save battery power.

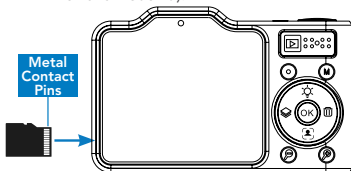
PLEASE NOTE

This digital camera requires the use of a Micro SD card (not included) to take photos, record videos and save files

5.2 INSTALLING MEMORY CARD

This camera is compatible for use with a Micro SD card (not included) with a capacity of up to 128GB. Install a compatible memory card before operating the camera.

- Turn **OFF** the camera using the **Power Button**.
- **Open** the **Charging Port Cover**.
- Locate the Micro SD card slot and properly insert the memory card with the contact pins facing upwards as shown below until it locks in place (indicated by a 'click' sound).



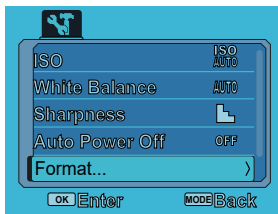
- **Close** the **Charging Port Cover**.

5.3 FORMATTING MEMORY CARD

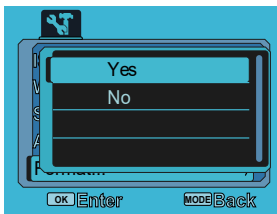
Please format the memory card before first use with this camera.

All data on the memory card will be lost after formatting. If necessary, please back up all data before formatting.

- Press the **Mode Button** to cycle through **Image Mode**, **Video Mode** and then **Settings Mode**.
- Press the **Up Key** and **Down Key** to find the **"Format"** option.



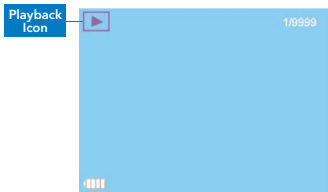
- Press the **OK Button** to confirm formatting.



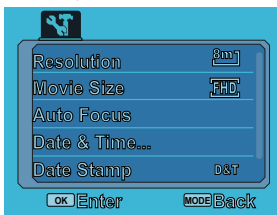
5.4 SETTINGS MODE

To access the **Settings Mode** menu:

- If required, first exit **Playback Mode** using the **Playback Button**.



- Press the **Mode Button** to cycle through **Image Mode**, **Video Mode** and then **Settings Mode**.



- Use the **Up Key / Down Key** to navigate screen options (sub-menus) and choose a setting.
- Press the **OK Button** to enter the selected mode.
- Press the **Mode Button** to exit **Settings Mode**.

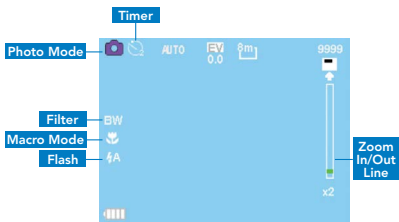

5.5 TAKING A PHOTO

The camera defaults to the Image Mode when it is powered on.

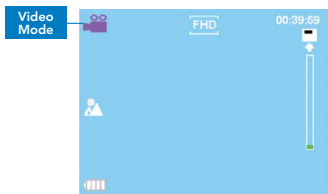
- Adjust the settings in the **Settings Mode** as required.
- Go to **Image Mode** using the **Mode Button**.
- Whilst in **Image Mode**:
 - Set the flash setting using the **Up Key**
 - Set the **filter** using the **Left Key**
 - Set the **timer** control using the **Down Key**
 - Turn on/off **macro mode** using the **Macro Button**. When macro mode is enabled, the best shooting distance is 10cm away from the front-facing lens.
 - Use the **Zoom In/Out Button** to frame the view.
 - To switch between front and rear lens, long press the **Down Key** for **3 seconds**.
- The front-facing lens supports the auto-focus function, with the focus range set between 50cm and infinite distance. When **AF** is enabled, press the **Shutter Button** once to auto focus. Skip this step when **AF function** is disabled.

- Press the **Shutter Button** to take photos.



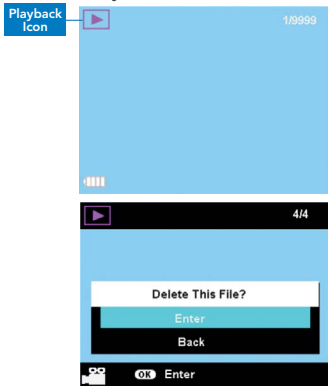
5.6 RECORDING A VIDEO

- Adjust the settings in the **Settings Mode** as required.
- Go to **Video Mode** using the **Mode Button**.
- Whilst in **Video Mode**:
 - Use the **Zoom In/Out Button** to frame the view.
 - To switch between front and rear lens, long press the **Down Key** for **3 seconds**.
- Press the **Shutter Button** to start/stop video recording.



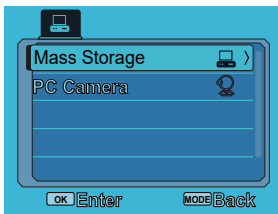
5.7 PLAYBACK AND DELETE FILES

- Go to to **Playback Mode** using the **Playback Button**.
- Use the **Zoom Out (-) Button** to enter the 3x3 quick view thumbnail mode. Whilst in the mode, use the **Left Key / Right Key / Up Key / Down Key** to browse through image and video files one by one.
- To choose and view a file, press the **OK Button**. For **video playback**, use the **Shutter Button** to start/pause/resume video play. During **video playback**, use the **Left Key / Right Key** to rewind and fast forward video.
- To delete the selected file, press the **Right Key (Delete) Button** and confirm deletion.
- To exit the **Playback Mode**, press the **Playback Button**.



5.8 TRANSFERRING IMAGE/VIDEO FILES TO COMPUTER

- Power off the camera. Connect the camera to the computer using the supplied USB cable.
- Power on the camera and wait for **2 seconds** until the Transfer Mode screen appears.
- Choose **Mass Storage** and confirm selection using the **OK Button**.
- Use the computer to access the USB drive. All images and video files are stored in the same folder.
- File path: **[USB Drive] > DCIM > 100MEDIA**

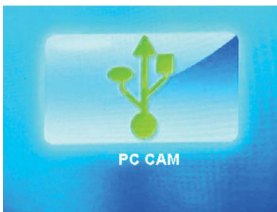
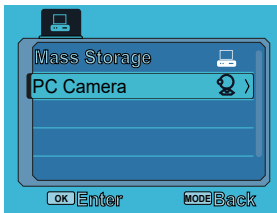


- Eject the device from the computer and unplug the camera USB cable after use.

5.9 USING THE CAMERA AS A WEBCAM

You can use the camera as webcam on your PC.

- Power off the camera. Connect the camera to the computer using the supplied USB cable.
- Power on the camera and wait for 2 seconds until the Transfer Mode screen appears.
- Choose **PC Camera** and confirm selection using the **OK Button**.
- Open the Cameras setting on your computer and select **General Image Device** under Connected Cameras.
- To stop using the camera, power off the camera.



6.0 TROUBLESHOOTING

PROBLEM	SOLUTION / TIP
Cannot take photos and videos	Check if the memory card is full. If so, please back up data and clear memory card first.
The images captured are blurry.	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Gently wipe the camera lens surface with a clean cloth if it is dirty.2. Hold your camera steady when taking photos.3. Use a tripod to stabilize the camera when taking photos.4. Take photos under good lighting conditions.
The photo or video is dim.	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Take photos or videos under good lighting conditions.2. Turn on flash when taking photo.
The camera automatically turns off.	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Charge the battery using the supplied USB cable.2. Set the "Auto Power Off" feature to Off.
The camera freezes up and cannot be turned off.	Gently insert a pin to lightly press against the hard reset button located inside the opening that is located next to the charging port cover with the marking " R ".
